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The charity purposes as defined in the Constitution (the full constitution is available to read on request):

Purposes

- 1. The organisation's purposes are:
 - 1.1 To advance education, training and broader education in the development of individual capabilities, skills and understanding by providing an area of land on which training courses may take place, as outlined in Section 7(2) of the 2005 Act.
 - 1.2 To advance public participation in sport by providing a recreation area for the development of sports such as mountain biking, pony trekking and walking, as outlined in Section 7 (2) of the 2005 Act.

Powers

- 2. The organisation has power to do anything which is calculated to further its purposes or is conducive or incidental to doing so.
- 3. No part of the income or property of the organisation may be paid or transferred (directly or indirectly) to the members either in the course of the organisation's existence or on dissolution except where this is done in direct furtherance of the organisation's charitable purposes.

Liability of members

4. The members of the organisation have no liability to pay any sums to help to meet the debts (or other liabilities) of the organisation if it is wound up; accordingly, if the organisation is unable to meet its debts, the members will not be held responsible.

Qualifications for membership

- 5. Membership is open to any individual aged 18 or over who lives on the Isle of Arran in North Ayrshire, Scotland. Juniors aged 12-17, can be members but not eligible to vote until they are 18.
- 6. Employees of the organisation are not eligible for membership.
- 7. The organisation shall have not fewer than 20 members at any time; and the majority of the members of the organisation shall consist of ordinary members; and in the event that the number of members falls below 20, the Board may not conduct any business other than to ensure the admission of sufficient Ordinary Members to achieve the minimum number and/or maintain the majority.

Application for Membership

Any person who wishes to become a member must sign a written application for membership; the application will then be considered by the board at its next board meeting.
